Exciting New Reading Initiative

To help encourage the children to enjoy reading their home reading books more frequently we will be sending them home with a reading bookmark with 10 stars on. They can colour in a star each time they read at home (this will be a maximum of 7 stars each week) and then bring their bookmark in and give it to the class teacher who will put it in a raffle. Each Friday during the celebration assembly, we will hold a reading raffle and a winning bookmark from each key stage will be chosen to take home the reading sack.

Each sack will contain: A teddy and a book

As a reward for reading the children will be able to keep the book they have chosen. This is an opportunity for the children to either read or be read to, snuggle up together and enjoy a lovely book. The sack and teddy must be returned the following Monday so that we can ensure it is ready for the next child.
