Particular celebrations to have been highlighted/discussed/celebrated in class—birthdays in class, Christmas, Diwali

Learning Steps	Key Knowledge (answers)
What is Chinese New Year?	Link to our new year and how they celebrate at a different
Why is each year named after an animal?	Read the traditional story of the animal race and link this to how each year is named after an animal based on the order they finished the race in. Look at what year we are in now.
How do the Chinese celebrate Chinese New Year? (several lessons)	Decorate houses—red banners for good luck Clean houses, Street parties, Dragon dances, new clothes, special meal Do these activities in class.
Reflection and assessment	Sorting images that are and aren't linked to CNY. Discuss comparison to other celebrations we have
Which celebrations to do we celebrate in school? At home?	List them and create a timeline. Halloween, Christmas, Diwali, Easter, Birthdays
When are our birthdays?	How do we celebrate our birthdays? Plot the children's birthdays on a month timeline.
Child Initiated Activities	

The key skills we want pupils to use during this topic:

To use **ANALYSING** of secondary sources (photos and videos) to find out about The Chinese New Year traditions and celebrations.

To develop understanding of **CHRONOLOGY** by ordering celebrations and birth-days on a calendar. To use the language associated with time: **then**, **before**, **now**, **next**, **soon**.

Key vocabulary

Gung hei fat choi	Happy Chinese new year
Chinese Zodiac	Animal zodiac linked to the traditional animal story
Celebrations	a social gathering or enjoyable activity held to celebrate something

Final Outcome

To be able to sort and discuss celebration images and through doing so, demonstrate their understanding.
