| Learning Steps | Key Knowledge (answers) |
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| What are the physical features of Italy? | Italy is a peninsular in the Mediterranean Sea. It is approx 1,130 km long and has a total area of approx 301,238 square km. It is mostly mountainous with ranges over 700 metres covering a third of the country. The best known are the Alps, the Dolomites and the Apennines. There are about 1500 lakes with the most famous being: Lakes Garda, Maggiore, Como, Iseo, and Lugano. There are over a thousand rivers and streams. Major rivers - the Po River, the Tiber, Arno, Reno, and Adige Rivers. There are four active volcanoes: Etna, Vesuvius, Stomboli and Vulcano. |
| Where is Italy in the world? Who are its neighbours? | Italy is part of Europe. It has land borders with Switzerland, France, Austria and Slovenia. It has two independent countries within its borders. Vatican City and San Marino. To the north west is the Ligurian sea, to the west and south west the Tyrrhenian sea, to the south and south east is the Ionian sea and to the east is the Adriatic sea. |
| What are the re- gions? How differ- ent or similar are they? | Italy is a republic with 20 regions. There are 15 ordinary regions called: Piedmont, Lombardy, Veneto, Liguria, Emilia, Umbria, Marche, Lazio, Abruzzo, Molise, Campania, Puglia, Basilicata, Tuscany and Calabria. Plus 5 special regions called: Sicily, Sardinia, Trentino–Alto Adige, Friuli–Venezia Giulia, and Valle d'Aosta. There are many similarities and differences. |
| What is different or similar about the seven major cities in Italy? | The cities are: Aosta, Florence, Milan, Naples, Palermo, Rome and Venice. Venice- tourist city built around canals. Rome - capital of Italy and an ancient city. The economic stability of Sicily is based on Palermo. Naples— 3rd largest city and capital of the south. Milan - 2nd largest city and capital of the north. Florence— one of the best economies and is located in Tuscany. Aosta— founded by the Romans in 25BC and is very close to Mont Blanc tunnel with easy access to France. |
| What is the city of Bologna like? | Bologna is the capital city of the Emilia Romagna Region in Northern Italy. Bologna is one of the richest cities due to its economy, architecture and cultures. Bologna is a Portico city, at the foothills of the Apennines and you can see the Alps on a clear day. |
| What is everyday life like for chil- dren in Bologna? | The activities that the children take part in reflect the Mediterranean climate of Italy. The children are Year 5 at the International School of Bologna. |
