To perform a story from a storyboard with accompanying music	Perform confidently using appropriate instrumental sounds.


Musical Knowledge

Know that musical instruments can be used to create 'real life' sound effects. Know that woodwind instruments, like flutes, are played by blowing air into or across a mouthpiece.

Know that stringed instruments, like violins, make a sound when their strings vibrate

Know that a brass instrument is played by vibrating your lips against the mouthpiece.

Know that some tuned instruments have a lower range of pitches and some have a higher range of pitches.
