What do we already know about kings and queens?

Queen Victoria was the Queen in the Victorian times. Before Queen Elizabeth II she was the longest reigning monarch. Queen Elizabeth II was Queen Victoria's great, great granddaughter.

Who is Queen Elizabeth II?

The Queen of England was the longest reigning monarch ever. Her coronation was 2nd June 1953. She had many homes and palaces. Her family is the Royal Family. As Queen she had to travel and meet different people. She loved animals and the countryside. She died on 8 September 2022

What is a coronation?

A coronation is when a King/ Queen take the crown and first become the King or Queen. The first coronation was for a king more than 1000 years ago.

How did people celebrate Queen Elizabeth II coronation?

People had parties in their streets, watched on TV (for many people it was their first ever TV) and ate coronation chicken.

What is the role of the Queen (Monarch)?

The Queen had many homes, castles and palaces around Britain which she had to look after. She travelled the World meeting lots of different important people and helped charities. She also had lots of letters to write to different people.
