Learning Steps	Key Knowledge
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<p>Lesson 1: To explore a range of money containers and examine their features.</p>	<p>Pass around a variety of purses, wallets and belt bags so children can examine them. What fabrics are they made from? How are they fastened? What do they smell and feel like? What features do they have? What do you think they would be used for and who would use them? Ask children to share their ideas with the class.</p>
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<p>Lesson 2: To learn how to sew using a range of different stitches.</p>	<p>Model how to thread the needle and how to pin two pieces of fabric together to make it easier to stitch. Also model how to start and finish off. Children use running stitch backstitch, and overstitch to join two pieces of fabric</p>
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<p>Lesson 3: To be able to design a money container.</p>	<p>Children design their money container .Encourage children to use exact measurements and include exact details in their plan.</p>
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<p>Lesson 4: To be able to make a money container using textiles.</p>	<p>Children to make their money container using their design from lesson 3. Ensure children work with accuracy, looking at the measurements on their plan and making sure that their stitches are neat and even.</p>
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<p>Lesson 5 : Use the design criteria to assess the different money containers. Record ideas.</p>	<p>Give children some time to have a look around at other people's work the invite them to find a partner and discuss each others money containers. Complete evaluation</p>
