- DT log will show a progression of skills within KS1, LKS2 and UKS2.
- Produce creative work, exploring their ideas and recording their experiences
- Become proficient in planning, creating and evaluating their work.
- Evaluate and analyse creative works using the appropriate language.
- DT projects will be taught within a whole school theme.



Our School DT Culture

- We use a variety of teaching and learning opportunities in DT.
- Pupils at King's Stanley Primary School will be aided in developing their own DT skills set through practise and progression alongside investigative work, developing skills and techniques and teacher modelling.
- All children will complete tasks within a whole school theme.
- Children will be encouraged and aided in self- reflection through recording an evaluation of their work at the end of each unit.
- Children will use a DT project log to record their visual journey.
- We celebrate all our children's achievements after each unit of work.

Assessment

- Children are assessed at the end of each unit/project.
- Photo evidence of coverage of each unit within each year group.
- Use of a DT log book throughout the school to reflect their learning journey.
