Learning Steps	Key Knowledge
To investigate a variety of vehicles and their uses and features.	Identify what a vehicle is, and identify its features.
To investigate wheels, axles and chassis.	Know the two different ways wheels and axles can be used:- wheels firmly fixed to the axle so the axle moves the wheels around, or - wheels loose on the static axle so that the wheels can turn around.
To be able to investigate ways of creating and decorating the chassis of a vehicle.	Explore different ways of creating the chassis of vehicles.
To be able to design a vehicle for the Royal Procession.	The vehicle must have wheels that move, axles and a chassis.
To be able to make a vehicle based on a design.	Follow their designs to make their vehicles.
To be able to evaluate a finished product.	Explain how well they think they did with the vehicles, what they did really well, what they think they could improve.
