Early Help

Early help is about identifying the right support for children, young people and their families as soon as problems emerge. It is also about identifying support at all stages of a child's life; pre-birth, childhood and or adolescence.

The purpose of early help is to prevent issues and problems becoming serious and harmful to the child and their respective family and community.

King's Stanley C of E Primary School recognises the importance of identifying and providing Early Help to parents, carers or family members who are concerned about their child. For parents, the school is easily accessible which creates a convenient starting point if anyone has concerns to share about their child.

We work alongside and in partnership with other agencies including the Advisory Teaching Service, Educational Psychologist, School Nursing Team, CYPS, Charities, Children Centres, Young Carer's, Families First Plus and Social Care.

Kings' Stanley C of E Primary School employs a Children and Families Worker who can offer targeted work with children as well as family support, advice and signposting.
