CONSENT

In primary school, consent is introduced as a fundamental concept emphasizing the importance of mutual agreement and respect.

Children learn that consent involves willingly and enthusiastically agreeing to something, whether it's sharing toys, playing games, or physical interactions.

Teachers emphasize the significance of asking for permission and understanding that everyone has the right to say "yes" or "no". Through age-appropriate discussions and activities, primary school students develop an early awareness of personal boundaries and the necessity of respecting the boundaries of others.

These foundational lessons in consent lay the groundwork for building positive relationships and promoting a culture of empathy and understanding. This approach is used in our wellbeing lessons (PHSCE) and regularly revisited in all year groups.
