Operation Encompass

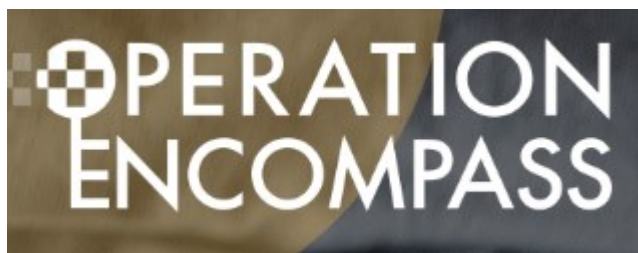
Operation Encompass is a safeguarding initiative designed to support parents of primary school children.
