In this session they were learning to use saws and hammers safely. The children were creating artwork with blocks of wood and had great fun!




#### World Book Day

Additionally, fostering a sense of belonging within the family and community provides a powerful counterbalance to the appeal of radical groups.

In the collective effort to prevent radicalization, parents serve as the first line of defence, shaping resilient individuals capable of navigating the complexities of the modern world.
