

Year One Curriculum Overview



TERM 6 2024-2025 ~ Who was Queen Elizabeth II?

English

After completing our unit on Jack and the Beanstalk, we will begin our final term's English with a narrative unit, Sidney Spider — a Tale of Friendship, which is an animal story based on a spider and his struggles with making friends. We will then write some riddles linking to animals and the seasons, as well as applying our writing skills in our cross curricular work.

Our handwriting focus will be preparing ourselves for cursive writing in Year Two, so we will be ensuring we are starting all letters in the correct place and making sure the height and size of our capital letters are correct too. We will be practising our tricky words and trying to spell them correctly in all written work.

Physical Education Monday and Thursday

In our outdoor PE this term we are going to be practising our sports day skills – jumping, racing and throwing. Our indoor PE sessions this term will develop and improve our balance, strength and co-ordination through Yoga.

History, Science, Computing & Music

Our key question in History is who was Queen Elizabeth II? We will be discussing what we would do if we were king or queen for the day and researching the life of Queen Elizabeth II, with a particular focus on her Coronation. We will compare the celebrations with those of King Charles III.

In Science we will be looking at the changes that have occurred across the four seasons. We have been tracking one of the apple trees in our school grounds and we will be working towards a written outcome describing the changes we have observed. We will also be looking at how the day length varies across the year and the weather associated with each of the seasons.

In Computing we will be using the iPads to take photographs. We will then learn how to edit them using simple tools.

In music we will be continuing with our Ukulele whole class music tuition and will have a concert on 3rd July where parents and carers will be invited to watch.

Mathematics

We will be using practical resources to explore place value of numbers to 100 with a specific focus on numbers from 50-100.

We will then be moving onto looking at money and time. Please give your children opportunities to see real coins to support their coin recognition and support them to add coins up to 20p.

In time, we will be sequencing events in order before looking at o'clock and half past times. We would be very grateful if you could use as many real-life examples of time during everyday life, particularly focusing on reading o'clock and half past times on an analogue clock.

We will be practising our fluency skills daily, with addition and subtraction of numbers up to 20.

Wellbeing

This term we will be looking at how our bodies and needs have changed since we were babies. One of the areas we will be talking about is around toileting and how this is a private time where children need to respect each other's privacy and ensure that good hygiene is practised.

RE

We will be continuing to explore our values of Resilience, Respect and Responsibility through class activities and worship. We are then learning more about Judaism, including special stories and celebrations.

Reading: Reading books will continue to be changed on Mondays and children can continue to choose a reading for pleasure book to share with you, throughout the week. Please ensure your child's reading books are in school EVERY day. Thank you.
