Pencil Cases

We've noticed that some pencil cases coming into school are starting to resemble small bags! While we love that our pupils are prepared and excited for learning, we do need to set a quick reminder about pencil case size and contents.

Our classroom drawers and desks are designed for small, simple storage so when pencil cases are too big or bulky, they don't fit and can end up causing clutter and distractions.

Children do not need their own pencil case in school but if they do like to bring one, it should be a simple design and small enough to fit in their drawer. It should only contain the essentials: pencils, ruler, rubber and a sharpener.

Keeping things simple helps us make the most of learning time.

Lateness & Attendance

We understand that mornings can be hectic and that occasional lateness is sometimes unavoidable. However, frequent lateness can have a significant effect on your child's learning and the overall classroom environment.

If your child arrives at school after 9:00am, they will be marked as late in the register. This lateness also counts towards their overall attendance record and is unauthorised.

When children arrive late, even by just a few minutes, it can

- Make it harder for them to settle into the day
- Mean they miss important instructions or learning
- Disrupt the class that's already started
- Leave them feeling rushed or behind

Starting the day on time helps children feel calm, confident, and ready to learn.

We understand that sometimes things happen, traffic, busy mornings and unexpected delays. If you're finding it hard to get your child to school on time regularly, please reach out so we can work together to find a solution.
