Student Spotlight

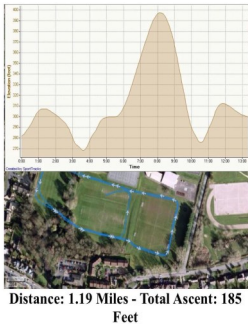
Back in October 2025, Edie in Y5 took part in the Atlas Cross Country event and qualified for the finals which were held earlier this month.
