Our younger children love learning through imaginative, hands-on play, and we're asking for your help to keep our outdoor provision well stocked.

We're looking for donations of clean, safe loose parts and everyday items such as wood, pipes, crates, kitchen utensils, buckets, toy vehicles and other open-ended resources that inspire creativity and exploration. Over time, these much-loved resources naturally become worn, broken or lost, so any donations are greatly appreciated.

If you have any of the items listed below, or anything similar that children could safely explore and create with, we'd love to hear from you. Thank you for your continued support, every donation helps enrich our children's learning through play.

- Long lengths of wood (up to 1.5m) – ideally sanded to avoid splinters
- Drain pipes and guttering
- Garden equipment (hand shovels, trowels, etc.)
- Buckets and spades
- Cable reels
- Pots, pans and kitchen utensils
- Wooden blocks (approx. brick-sized)
- Golf balls, bolts and other assorted loose items
- Tarpaulins and sheets
- Strong plastic crates and milk crates
- Artificial grass offcuts
- Strong plastic storage boxes
- Small and large toy cars and diggers
- Buttons, stones and pebbles
- Strong rope
- Plastic piping (flexible piping)
- Logs
- Brooms
- Corrugated plastic or metal sheets
- Hoops (various sizes)
