



Year 2 Term 6 Topic Overview “Beside the Seaside”

	<p><u>English:</u> This term we will be learning warning tales, starting by learning the traditional tale 'How the Tortoise got his shell', before creating our own versions. Our non-fiction work will link to our topic and we will be creating persuasive adverts and leaflets for the seaside and local area. In our handwriting we will be working on the height and size of capital letters and tall letters and perfecting our feeder-leader lines.</p>	<p><u>Maths:</u> This term we will be consolidating our understanding of the four operations - addition, subtraction, multiplication and division in our daily Fluent in Five. Every week we will be testing our speed and accuracy in Quick Maths. We will also be focusing on measure solving real life problems involving mass, length and capacity. We will be also collecting data in tally charts and producing graphs to present our results.</p>	
	<p><u>P.E:</u> In the summer term, we will be making the most of the outdoor space - fingers crossed for good weather! Our main focus will be Athletics - we are going to be learning about the skills used in different athletic sports such as 100m and 200m sprint, throwing, javelin and jumping. We will also be practising different events in preparation for Sport's Day. To complete up the term we will play Rounders and French cricket.</p>	<p><u>R.E:</u> This term the school's theme is Justice and we will be exploring and reflecting on this in classroom activities and school worship. In our lessons, we will be thinking about what makes some places scared to believers. We will look at special buildings, such as the church and mosque and discover what objects and symbols are special inside them.</p>	
	<p><u>P.S.H.E and Citizenship (Personal, Social and Health Education):</u> We will be starting this term with a whole school 'Healthy Me Week'. This will be a fun week which looks at a how variety of activities can help us to stay healthy, including sports, positive mindset, relaxation and managing positive feelings and friendships. We will also be sharing our hopes and fears for moving into Year Three and looking back at our favourite Year Two moments.</p>	<p><u>Music:</u> In Music, we will be using the theme of numbers to learn about beat. We will be learning songs, chants and raps to reinforce steady beats. We will follow on by exploring pitch by singing songs and listening to the melodies before exploring our own musical ideas using a range of instruments.</p>

	<p>ICT: Our ICT work will link to our topic and other subject areas. This will include using the internet and Google maps to explore the area we live and coastal areas in Geography. We will think about how to use the internet sensibly and how to keep ourselves safe online. We are also going to be improving our basic keyboard skills, typing, using different fonts and colours and saving work.</p>	<p>Art and Design Technology: Our art work will initially link to our English text - 'How the tortoise got his shell' - and we will be making masks and role-playing the story. We will then go on to create a variety of tortoise shells using different mediums, including fabric, collage and printing. When learning about seaside towns and coastal features, we will make models in DT.</p>	
	<p>Topic: In the first part of the term we will be focusing on our Science topic of Materials. We will learn about different types of materials and their qualities. We will then move onto looking at coasts, with the key question 'Why do we love to be beside the seaside?' During this topic we will discuss why people visit the coast and learn about coastal features. This will also involve a trip to the seaside to observe it's features and attractions first hand! Finally, we will go on to compare King's Stanley and a seaside town.</p>	<p>Additional Information: Please ensure your child has suitable PE kits for both indoor and outdoor PE, particularly footwear. We would like to welcome Miss Page, a final year teaching student, who will continue working and teaching with us for the first half of Term 6. Homework will continue to be set over 2 weeks, due in on a Tuesday and handed out on a Thursday and spelling will be tested weekly on a Monday. Please encourage your children to use their best handwriting and presentation in all their homework tasks.</p>
