

Sports Funding 2017-2018

The government provides additional funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding has been provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport.

This year our funding was £17,770

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools and to embed physical activity into the school day.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

At King's Stanley Primary School, we identified the following areas to allocate the money.

Key Indicator	Impact
Rowing participation	<p>100% of Year 3, Year 4, year 5 and 6 children involved in rowing sessions</p> <p>15 children continued these sessions by joining the rowing club after school. 33% of these children were not part of another sports club.</p> <p>3 year 6s participated in the South-West Championships</p> <p>All 3 won medals</p>

Key Indicator	Impact
Countryside skills	<p>Countryside skills is a great initiative that allows all learners to develop confidence and self-esteem.</p> <p>All children in the school (Rec to Y6) took part in the Countryside skills' programme.</p> <p>These sessions have had a sustainable impact for all pupils.</p>

Key Indicator	Impact
Netball coach	<p>19 Children attended a weekly netball session after school and entered School Games competitions.</p> <p>5 Y6 pupils also took on leadership roles during these sessions.</p>

Key Indicator	Impact
PGL afternoon activity	Allowing all Y6 children to participate in an extra adventurous activity during a residential stay.

Key Indicator	Impact
Transport	<p>The pupils were provided with access to School Games competitions such as indoor athletics and hockey.</p> <p>Transport was provided for swimming lessons and trials, as well as attending the swimming gala itself.</p> <p>We placed 1st in the competition</p> <p>Bronze Sports Mark award attained.</p>

Equipment	Children able to access the equipment needed to fully participate in the sporting opportunities available.

Key Indicator	Impact
Swimming instructor	Extra swimming coach paid for to ensure that all Y6 pupils were able to swim 25 m by the end of the year.
